Subject: Above and Beyond August 2020

On Saturday evening the 8th of August 2020, I was returning home from a call in Campbell County at about 9pm. As i was heading west on Interstate 275 just prior to the Wilder exit I observed a car stopped in the middle of the fast and middle lane of the interstate. The car was smoking heavily and front end was destroyed. I immediately turned on my strobe lights and blocked the two lanes of interstate and called 911. I left my vehicle to check on the driver of the car. The driver was unconscious and unresponsive. I gained entry to the vehicle and shut it off and checked driver. He did not respond to my attempts. The first officer arrived and I advised him the driver appeared to be overdosed and needed Narcon immediately. We removed the driver from the car and to the shoulder of the road. I provided a kneeling pad to put under his head and the officer administered the first of two doses of Narcan. A nurse heading east on the interstate saw us and stopped and began checking on the driver. He stated the pulse was gone and no pupil response to light. A second dose was administered and the driver began to respond to us. I truly believe that without the quick actions on my behalf that this man may not be alive today.

i would also like to recognize Christopher York. He had received a call from his girlfriend that told him she had just passed the accident and saw one of our trucks there and thought I was

involved in the accident. He immediately jumped in his truck and came t the scene to check on me. This shows Chris's dedication and concern about his co-workers. I feel that he went above and beyond by coming out to check on me. I would like to see Chris recognized for his actions in this situation.
